Biography By Denise Rosenberger

I have always wanted to fly. In the 1960's I wanted to be an astronaut, but being a girl, was told I should consider other options. Other options were few and unacceptable and I was too short to be a flight attendant. I have actually had several careers. I was a dental assistant and lab tech for many years. I was a floral designer, an artist's manager and fiber artist specializing in wearable arts and the Florida Environment, and finally a line manager for a flight school.

I actually began flying hot air balloons in 1981 when I met my second husband. I obtained my commercial hot air balloon rating with on-board heater so that I could pilot while he photographed for a book that we authored and copublished called The Art of Hot Air Ballooning. I soloed in Sevierville, TN just outside the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. It was an amazing flight, so beautiful, peaceful and free. After we divorced and he got custody of the balloon I didn't fly balloons but a few more times. I miss it terribly. I decided that I had listened to what I couldn't be for too long and began my fixed-wing training at Clearwater Airpark in 1990 and finished the following year at PIE with the same wonderful instructor. I was (and still am) a single parent with two girls, no money and no steady job. (I did have 6 part time jobs.) When I got enough money for a flight, I booked

a lesson. Sixteen months, June 16, 1991. later I flew to Lakeland Linder Airport on a beautifully clear morning and took my check-ride. I had my doubts, but my instructor trusted my ability and I did very, verv well.

I joined the Ninety Nines in 1994 and with the help of three 99 angels I joined International to be eligible for the Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarship. After a few tries I actually won twice! for my Instrument rating and for my commercial multi-engine with instrument. I had obtained my commercial in between on my own. I owe so much to the Ninety Nines and the friends I have made here that it is inexpressible. I have worked as Operations Manager for two local flight schools, both now out of business, administrative assistant for a charter/lease/ management/ maintenance/avionics company, (while there I was able to fly as first officer on a few flights) and now as a Customer Service and Operations Agent for Allegiant Air. Airlines are a whole other ball of wax, but I am enjoying myself immensely. I was appointed as an airport Aviation Safety Counselor, now called a FAASTEAM Representative, for Clearwater Airpark and then at large. I hold monthly safety meeting here in Clearwater on Hercules Ave. Go to www.FAASafetv.gov for listing. I coordinate a display in the local library every other year on Women in Aviation and I speak annually during the Great American Teach-In in local schools. I LOVE to talk about aviation and Women in Aviation. Just ask me!l had some health setbacks but am again current and currently working on my CFI (again) with the help of 491/2 Jim Pappas and hope to be done later this year. I want to make pilots and pass on my passion for flying and aviation as well as make dreams, sometimes long held like mine, come true.
